Paul Zambrano, Regional Technical Advisor of Alive & Thrive Southeast Asia

Paul is a medical doctor with a master's degree in Nutrition for Global Health from the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine. He has more than a decade of experience in maternal and child nutrition, including humanitarian coordination. Paul previously worked in major emergencies in and outside the Philippines with Save the Children, WHO, and UNICEF. He was nutrition cluster coordinator and UNICEF Health and Nutrition Specialist during the Rohingya refugee crisis in Myanmar in 2013. In his current role as Regional Technical Advisor of Alive & Thrive Southeast Asia, Paul provides technical support to strengthen breastfeeding-friendly policy environments and health systems in Southeast Asia. He is part of the WHO Breastfeeding Evidence Group and is co-author of recent publications on the Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes, maternity protection, human milk banking, and several others. Paul is based in Manila, Philippines.



Karleen Gribble, IFE Core Group

Dr Karleen Gribble is an Adjunct Associate Professor in the School of Nursing and Midwifery at Western Sydney University. Her interests include infant and young child feeding in emergencies, regulation of the marketing of breastmilk substitutes, and child rights. She has many publications in peer-reviewed journals on these subjects. She is a member of the steering committee of the Infant and Young Child Feeding in Emergencies Core Group and has been involved in policy development, training and advocacy in the area of infants and young children in emergencies since 2006. Karleen passionately advocates for recognition of the importance of mothers to their infants and works to create environments that support breastfeeding and the mother-infant relationship, particularly in situations of adversity. She is also an Australian Breastfeeding Association Community Educator and Breastfeeding Counsellor.



Jodine Chase, co-founder of SafelyFed Canada

Jodine Chase is a public relations and communications consultant specializing in issues and crisis management news analysis. Jodine is a co-founder of SafelyFed Canada, which is a national, non-profit, non-partisan organization dedicated to the protection of infants and young children in emergency through safe and appropriate feeding. SafelyFed Canada advocates for improved infant feeding policy federally, provincially. Jodine is a long-time breastfeeding advocate who, as a volunteer, has worked for many breastfeeding-related causes including advocating for the re-establishment of milk banks, amending policies and legislation to protect breastfeeding rights. Alessandro Iellamo, IFE Core Group

Alessandro Iellamo is a maternal, infant, and young child nutrition specialist. He has extensive expertise in infant and young child feeding (IYCF) policies and practices, particularly in emergencies, and the WHO International Code and other global tools. He has worked with the WHO's Scientific and Technical Advisory Group (STAG) on the International Code and assisted the International Baby Food Action Network with the development of the World Breastfeeding Trends Initiative (WBTI) and IYCF policy tools. He has also been involved in research on IYCF policies, practices and programmes, including work environments, International Code implementation, and financial aspects of the WHO/UNICEF Global Strategy on IYCF. His expertise in nutrition, emergency nutrition, and IYCF has supported humanitarian work in Africa, the Middle East and South-East Asia. Recently, he has been engaged with IYCF related policy issues in high-income countries including Italy, Australia, and Japan. Alessandro has led the planning, organization and facilitation of webinars and workshops, including the independent dialogue hosted by the Institute for Climate, Energy & Disaster Solutions and the ANU Gender Institute at the Australian National University.
